If the compliance report is not submitted, the Renewal Application for the year 2021-22 will not be accepted.

*** Conditions:**

1. The conditions laid out by the Local Inquiry Committee must be complied with.
2. If the admission of students exceeds the intake limit fixed by the University shall not approve the excess admission.
3. Without prior approval by the University, no course (s) / branches shall be increased.
4. While making student admissions to the courses the college shall follow strictly the Government orders relating to comply with the conditions of the affiliation, intake fixed from time to time reservation issued by the Government from time to time.
5. College is expected to adhere to all Circulars/Notifications issued by the university from time to time regarding Teaching and Non-Teaching staff. The college shall not violate the content of orders issued by the University such as intake, new course affiliation and eligibility condition and the eligibility criteria for the students admissions prescribed by the University.
6. College shall admit the students to their Post Graduate courses adhering to the Fee structure as fixed by the University with seat allocation of not more than 50% for private Institutions (Government Colleges 100%)

7. As per Supreme Court Order in respect of Vaishaka V/s Government of Rajasthan case dated 13-08-1997 Teaching staff/ Non-Teaching staff/ Management / Students involving in any Sexual harassment against women or a girl student is punishable. Such Officials / Students are liable to be dismissed from their jobs or debarred from the course from the college. As per Hon'ble Court order the College shall constitute a Grievance Cell for receiving such complaints.
8. The college shall aim at improving the educational standards of the students. The Management/Principal shall treat the student community, Teaching and Non-teaching staff with utmost respectfully.
9. The college shall not withhold any document submitted by students, like marks sheet, etc. for more than six months, unnecessarily. After the process of completion of admission approval, the documents must be returned to the students at the earliest and the same shall be informed to the University.
10. If any student requests for Transfer Certificate, the same must be issued without causing any Inconvenience to the students by the college. The College shall collect fees only for the respective Year or Semester, if any kind of excess fee should not collected by the College.
11. The College shall not charge any kind of 'Capitation fee' from any student.
12. College must transact all Correspondences in Kannada compulsorily.
13. College must submit the application for Renewal of Affiliation for year 2021-22 without fail.
14. The Colleges that have completed Five years must get Accreditation by NAAC.
15. The Principal shall submit the list of valuers for valuation work to the Chairpersons of Respective Board of Examiners and send them compulsorily for the Valuation Work, failure to do so, the affiliation of the College will be cancelled.
16. Considering less than 40% of the marks obtained by your college in the computerized format of the college affiliation process, the syndicate has resolved to grant affiliation for one year as one time measure as recommended by the LIC. The syndicate has directed to put a Condition that a college must improve the academic and the basic infrastructure within one Year.
17. Every year extension of AICTE approval is must.
18. The Institution shall abide by the condition laid down by the AICTE, New Delhi, BCU.
19. Admission to MBA and MCA courses shall be made as per the seat matrix fixed by the KEA.

Conditions:

1. Shall comply with the conditions stipulated by the local enquiry committee and academic council.
2. If the prescribed intake of students exceeds, the University will not accord approval for the excess intake.
3. The sections shall not be increased for any course without the prior approval of the University.
4. While making admission to the said Degree course, the reservation orders issued from the Government from time to time shall be scrupulously followed.
5. The college shall abide by the rules and regulations and order to be issued by the university as and when with regard to the students, Teaching and non-teaching staff. Admissions should be made as per the course wise sanctioned intake and eligibility criteria fixed by the University.
6. The admission to the Post Graduation Courses out of the total admissions 50% of the seats shall be filled in by the candidates sponsored by the University by not exceeding the admissions fees and other fees as fixed by the University from time to time.
7. As per the order of the Supreme Court dated 13-08-1997 in the case pertaining to Vaishaka Vs. State of Rajasthan, giving any sort of harassment to the ladies/girl students by any person (Lecturer/Non-Lecturer/Managing Committee) or any boy student will be punishable offence. Any person/boy student who is involved in the said activities, such persons shall be



- dismissed from the job/studentship. As per the order of the Supreme Court, in order to control such offences/activities, the college shall organize a committee accepting such complaints.
8. The Principal/Managing Committee shall treat the students and lecturers in service with due courtesy in order to improve the academic standards.
 9. The College shall not keep marks card and other documents belonging to the students not more than six months unnecessarily with them. The marks card and other documents obtained from the students for approval of the admission, should be returned immediately to the students after approval of the admission and University shall be kept informed in this regard.
 10. Transfer Certificates shall be issued to them without giving any trouble to the student on requisition, College is not permitted to charge any additional fees other than the tuition fees of the incomplete duration of the course year/semester.
 11. Kannada should be used in administration.
 12. The College shall not collect capitation fee of any sort.
 13. The renewal of the affiliation for the academic year 2021-2022 should be submitted to the university.
 14. College those completed five years have to obtain the recognition from NAAC.
 15. The Principal should send the eligible teachers list for evaluation to do the BOE Chairpersons Concerned. The eligible teachers should compulsorily report for evaluation work; failing which The College affiliation will be cancelled.

These regulations shall be called as Academic Regulations of the MBA Degree course (Day & Evening) of Bengaluru Central University, from academic year 2019- 20 onwards, under Choice Based Credit System (BCU-PG-CBCS, 2018) of Faculty of Commerce and Management under Bengaluru Central University, Bengaluru and the Degree called as Master of Business Administration.

2. EXTENT OF APPLICATION

These regulations will apply to Post Graduate Program in Management called MBA (Master Of Business Administration) being offered by the PG Department of Management Studies, Bengaluru Central University and all the colleges affiliated to the Bengaluru Central University having obtained the approval of this university and AICTE subject to complying with all the requirements and conditions laid down by these regulatory bodies.


MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM) (MBA-CBCS FROM ACADEMIC YEAR - 2019 - 20 ONWARDS)

3. MINIMUM ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION AND ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- A graduate degree under 10+2+3, 10+2+4 or 10+2+5 pattern under any discipline securing at least 50% marks in the aggregate including languages from a recognized University of UGC in India or abroad.
- Degrees from abroad should be accepted as equivalent to the Degree offered by any University in India by the UGC and as approved by AIU and Bengaluru Central University.
- In case of SC/ST/Cat-I candidates, there will be a relaxation of 5% in the aggregate marks obtained in the under graduate Degree set as minimum eligible marks (50%) for admission into MBA Course.
- All admissions to Post Graduate Department of Management and its affiliated colleges will be made through an entrance test conducted by appropriate body duly constituted and duly approved by Government of Karnataka and State Level Counselling board on the basis of Rank Merit and the reservation rules based on seat matrix as announced by the Government of Karnataka shall be strictly adhered to.

4. DURATION OF THE COURSE

The duration of the MBA Day & Evening program shall extend to over 4 semesters comprising a period of 2 years. Each year shall have two semesters of 16 weeks duration and shall have the

less than 90 working days of classroom teaching, internship and master thesis. At the end of each semester there will be end semester university examination conducted by the university.

5. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The course being a professional course and having Global connotation the medium of instruction for MBA Course Day and Evening examination shall be in English medium only

6. MINIMUM CREDITS AND MAXIMUM CREDITS

6.1 There shall be four categories of papers viz., Core and Compulsory paper, Soft Core paper, Specialization paper and Open Elective paper. The Open Electives are the University approved papers offered by other Departments of Bengaluru Central University and the student is required to undergo one course from other Department.

6.2 The credits for each of Compulsory paper and specialization paper may vary from 2 to 4 credits. In case of open electives and Soft Core, each paper shall be of 2 credits. A student is required to opt for one open elective paper in 3rd Semester. The list of papers available will be intimated from time to time

One credit is equivalent to 15 contact hours.

7. ATTENDANCE

7.1 The candidate who does not put in minimum stipulated attendance of 75% aggregate of all the subjects put together in a semester shall not be eligible to appear for the end exam in that semester and the candidate has to re attend the classes along with subsequent batch and satisfy the minimum requirement for appearing in that particular end semester examination.

7.2 The statement of attendance shall be displayed on the Notice Board by the Department/School/Institution at end of every month for information of students.

7.3 Five marks in Internal Assessment is earmarked for the attendance percentage as a motivation for the students to attend classes regularly.

is to be carried out under the guidance of a faculty of the institution and industry. This could involve a desk study/data analysis/technology enabled assignment/enterprise resource planning/live case study/extension work or exploration of an idea or its implementation. Specific guidelines including Format of the report shall be issued by PG Department of Management Studies, Bengaluru Central University from time to time

12.2 The industry internship program shall carry 50 marks, of which the internship report shall carry 25 marks and 25 marks for viva voce. The student has to secure a minimum of 25 marks out of 50 marks to pass in the internship program. The viva voce and the internship report will be evaluated by the external examiners and internal examiners appointed by the BOE.

13. MASTER THESIS

13.1 Every student is required to work 45 days (30 days compulsory to attend the industry field work) on his/her master thesis in the chosen major specialisation during the 3rd and 4th semester and prepare a Master Thesis report applying research methodology under the supervision of a Faculty guide and Industry expert. The Thesis shall be based on a free-lance or industry project. Prior to the actual work, the students are required to submit a synopsis of the proposed project work incorporating the components of research design and submit the same to the PG Department of Management Studies, BCUB for approval. There is no class work during 30 days where the student is in industry/fieldwork. Subsequent to the field work, the candidate has to involve himself/herself in writing the master thesis along with attending the classes regularly.

13.2 The students are required to submit two progress reports during the course of master thesis at the stipulated time periods.

13.3 A hard bound copy and a soft copy of the Master Thesis duly signed by the faculty guide and certified by the industry/organizations and Principal/ Director/HOD has to be submitted to the PG Department Management Studies, Bengaluru Central University at the end of the fourth semester before the commencement of the end semester examination. The Master Thesis shall be evaluated for 100 marks by two examiners (One of them will be the faculty guide/member who has guided the work and other will be the external/internal examiners appointed by the BOE). A minimum of 50% marks shall be secured for a pass in the Master Thesis. There shall be a viva-voce examination for 50 marks on the Master Thesis. Viva-voce will be conducted by Board of Examiners/examiners authorized by Chairman of BOE. A minimum of 50% (25 marks) must be secured to pass in the viva-voce examination.

13.4 Academic Integrity and Plagiarism

In order to maintain the quality in preparation and presentation of internship reports/master thesis in 3rd and 4th semester. All the internship reports master thesis should undergo the anti-plagiarism check with the support of suitable software. The Post Graduate Department of Management shall inform the B- Schools about the software and provide them guidelines thereof. The similarity index permissible will be decided from time to time.

14. SPECIALIZATION STREAMS


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14.1. The MBA program has dual specialization. It consists of major specialization and minor specialization. In 3rd and 4th semester the student has to take 3 electives in the major specialization and 2 electives in the minor specialization. If the student has studied 6 electives in one specialization in both 3rd and 4th semester MBA program, it is termed as major specialization.

14.2 For offering any specialization indicated in the MBA program, each institution shall have a minimum of 10 students.


14.3 The Board of Studies in Management could explore collaborations and partnership either with associations, industry body, individual companies and other enterprises for the purposes of curriculum design, delivery, faculty development, publication of study material and case studies. The BOS is also authorized to make necessary changes in the specialization streams as well as electives offered under the specialization streams. Any emerging area/subject leading to specialization will be identified and offered from time to time.

15. FOUNDATION COURSES AND ADD ON COURSES

15.1 The colleges are required to organize one week to ten days of induction programme for the students admitted to the first semester before the commencement of classes. Since the students come from different backgrounds such as arts, science, engineering etc, the foundation courses are intended not only to provide the basics and fundamental pre-requisite knowledge on management subjects but also include value-based and familiarise the students with management concepts. Similar induction could be planned at the time of the commencement of III Semester. A detailed report has to be submitted to university. After completion of 2nd semester, the institution shall arrange for project report preparation workshops for the students to take up the master thesis work in the 4th semester confidently.

15.2 The suggestive areas for Foundation courses are Social impact of management, Fundamentals of Management, Accounting and Finance, Sustainable development, Anti-Corruption Issues, Moral Leadership, and Business Ethics. Specific guidelines will be issued by PG Department of Management from time to time.

15.3 The students are required to undergo a non credit course(at least one) Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) each year. The list of courses will be supplied by the PG Department of Management Studies, Bengaluru Central University. Students are required to produce certification of completion of course during Viva Voce Exam.



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**NOTIFICATION REGARDING TO MASTER OF COMMERCE (M.Com) /
BC SYSTEM FROM 2014-15 ONWARDS**

The objective of the **Master of Commerce course** is to impart to the students professional education and training in various aspects of business and its environment and provide them with opportunities to develop managerial and analytical skills in order to meet the challenges of business at the national and global level.

2. Eligibility for Admission:

A candidate who has passed the B.Com/B.B.M/ BBS and BBA Degree examination of this University or of any other University re

cognized as equivalent thereto and has secured not less than 50% of the marks in the aggregate in all the Commerce subjects of Business Education in all the years (Examinations of the B.Com/BBM course) shall be eligible for admission to the course. In the case of SC/ST/Cat-I students and blind students the minimum percentage of marks required shall be less by 5%.

3. Duration of the Course:

The course of study for M.Com, degree shall extend over a period of two years divided into 4 (four) semesters. Each Semester will be of 16 weeks or more duration with a minimum of 90 actual working days.

4. Scheme of Instruction:

1. In each semester there will be seven papers (including practicals)
2. There will be 27 contact hours per week. This includes practicals.
3. Candidates are required to maintain record for computer practicals, which will have to be certified by the Chairman / Co-ordinator of the course, failing which students will not be permitted to take the end semester examination in that subject.

5. Attendance:

Each course (theory/practical) shall be treated as an independent unit for the purpose of attendance. A student shall attend a minimum of 75% of the total instruction hours in a course (theory/practical) including tutorials and seminars in each semester. There shall be no provision for condonation of shortage of attendance and a student who fails to secure 75% attendance in a course shall be required to repeat that semester.

6. Medium of Instruction:

The medium of instruction shall be English. However a candidate will be permitted to write the examination either in English or in Kannada.

8.1 Each semester will normally have six (Hardcore) and one (soft core) paper and each shall be for 100 marks.

8.2 (i) The composition of theory and internal assessment marks for each paper will be 70 and 30 respectively. However, in Computer related papers it will be 70+30 (theory + practical).

ii. Duration of examination per theory paper of 70 marks shall be for 3 hours, for practicals it will be 1½ (one and half) hours.

iii. Practical records will be evaluated as part of the practical examination.

iv. In case of practical examinations, students will be assessed on the basis of knowledge of processes, skills operations involved, results/calculations and reporting.

v. Practical examination will be conducted with both internal and external examiners. If the external examiner absents, then the examination will be conducted by two internal examiners.

8.3 Every theory paper shall ordinarily consist of two/three sections, developed to testing of conceptual skills, understanding skills, comprehension - skills, articulation and application skills.

8.4 (i) In case of theory papers the various components of internal assessment will be as follows:

- a) Assignment – 5 Marks
- b) Attendance – 5 marks
- c) Internal Test – 20 Marks

(The test shall be for 1½ hour duration carrying 40 marks. The marks scored by the candidate shall be later reduced to 20 marks)

(ii) The Departmental Council / College / Centre shall notify in the first week of each semester, scheme of internal assessment, containing the details of tests, assignments, and seminars.

(iii) Co-ordination Committee: In order to monitor IA tests there shall be Co-ordination Committee consisting of the following:

- 1. Chairman BOS: Chairman
- 2. One Senior Faculty Member

(v) The Departmental Council / College / Centre may decide, to give test/seminar to candidates who absent themselves for the above, only if the Council is convinced that the absence of the candidate is on valid grounds. However, the Council will allow the candidate to avail of this provision within the duration of that semester.

(vi) The statement of internal assessment shall be sent to the Registrar (Evaluation) one week prior to the commencement of that particular semester examination.


Each student will choose business research project live business problem in a business organization or industry, and prepare a dissertation report. He/she will formulate it as a research/consultancy problem, work under the guidance of a faculty member on it during the II & III semesters, prepare a report based on his/her work under the guidance of a faculty member and submit at the end of each semester. This will be evaluated for 150 marks. Project Dissertation guidance for a faculty member will involve a workload of 5 hours per week in a semester. Dissertation guidance of 8 students by a faculty member will be equivalent to the teaching of one paper per semester. Viva voce examination will be conducted for 50 marks by BOE.

9. Board of Examiners and Valuation of Answer Scripts:

9.1 There shall be a Board of Examiners for scrutinizing and approving the question papers and scheme of valuation.

9.2 About 50% of the examiners appointed for setting of question papers and valuation work in each semester shall be external.

9.3 Each written paper shall be valued by one internal examiner and one external examiner. Each practical examination shall be jointly conducted and evaluated by one internal examiner and one external examiner or two external examiners.

Regulations of Master of Computer applications (MCA) Course

- 1 **TITLE OF THE COURSE:** The course shall be called MCA – Master of Computer Applications.
- 2 **DURATION OF THE COURSE:** The course of study shall be three years.
- 3 **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:** A candidate with any degree of a minimum of 3 years duration (10+2+3) of Bangalore university or of any other University equivalent there in to with a minimum of 50% of marks in the aggregate of all subjects including languages, if any, provided further, that the candidate has studied mathematics / Computer science /Business Mathematics / Statistics / Computer Applications / Electronics as a subject at PUC level or equivalent HST (XII Standard) or at Degree level is eligible for admission to MCA Course. Relaxation to SC/ST, Group I be extended as per University norms.
- 4 **ATTENDANCE:** In each Semester a candidate should be considered to have successfully undergone the prescribed Course of study if the candidate has attended at least 75% of the classes in each subject (Theory, Lab & Practical).
- 5 **SCHEME OF EXAMINATION:**
 - A The Internal Assessment marks should be decided for each of the theory subjects by conducting 2 tests, each of 60 minutes duration, spread over the span of a Semester. A seminar should also be given by the student in the third year and the same to be assessed and evaluated for internal assessment along with the two tests.
 - B The Internal Assessment marks in Practical course is based on the performance in the Laboratory. The Internal Assessment marks for Project work of a candidate is based on the dissertation Seminar.
- 6 **ELIGIBILITY TO GO TO THE HIGHER SEMESTER:**
 - A A Candidate is allowed to carry over all the previous unleared (failed) theory papers and Practicals to subsequent semesters from the first to sixth semester.
 - B The maximum period for completion of the course shall be six years from the date of admission.
- 7 **MINIMUM FOR PASS AND DECLARATION OF RESULTS**
 - A For a pass in a semester, a candidate shall secure a minimum of 40% of the marks prescribed for a subject in the University Examination (Theory, Practical, Project work) and 50% of the marks in the aggregate inclusive of the Internal Assessment marks obtained in all subjects put together.
 - B The candidates who do not satisfy 7(a) shall be deemed to have failed and have to take exams in the subjects in which he has secured less than 40% at the University examination.
